# BIOGRAPHY

## ALEXANDRA DE HOOP SCHEFFER

**DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH FOR TRANSATLANTIC SECURITY & DIRECTOR OF PARIS OFFICE, THE GERMAN MARSHALL FUND OF THE UNITED STATES**

Dr. Alexandra de Hoop Scheffer is the director of the Paris office of the [Think Tank German Marshall Fund of the United States](#) (GMF) and the director of research for Transatlantic Security. Her areas of expertise include geopolitics, transatlantic relations, U.S. foreign policy and European affairs. She is the managing director of the [Transatlantic Trends](#) survey and of GMF's Business Alliance, a platform for companies to gain access to GMF's international expertise, events, networks of influential government and business leaders, and cutting-edge analysis.

Before joining GMF, Alexandra de Hoop Scheffer held several positions in the French government and academia and advised international organizations. She served as a senior advisor for U.S. foreign policy and transatlantic relations on the Policy Planning Staff of the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs (2009–11). From 2010 to 2013, she was an advisor to NATO's Supreme Allied Commander Europe (SACEUR). From 2006 to 2009, she served as a consultant to the French Ministry of Defense, on U.S. defense policy and the future of conflicts, while conducting her PhD at Sciences Po Paris. Her expertise is also regularly sought by major companies to assist them in anticipating global risks.

Alexandra de Hoop Scheffer is an associate professor at Sciences Po Paris, member of the advisory board of the *Fondation pour la Recherche Stratégique* (FRS) and member of the editorial board of the *Washington Quarterly* journal. She holds a PhD in political science, two master's degrees from Sciences Po Paris and a bachelor's degree in war studies from Kings College London. She is the author of the book *Hamlet en Irak* (CNRS éditions, 2007) and she regularly publishes articles and op-eds in international newspapers and journals.
